A discussion about the mercury content in low energy light bulbs ensued, comment was made that condensing lamps are due to be banned shortly on the continent.

A question was asked about composting kitchen waste from businesses, AG commented that it could only be vegetable matter that was composted, no meat products could be recycled of in this way. AG stated that she would investigate composting units and feedback her findings.
